



Panayioti is one of nine to receive national scholar athlete recognition. Panayioti was Captain of his team, made first team All-League Big North Patriot Division, led the team in goals and assists during Junior and Senior years and led his team to his high school's first ever North 1 Group 2 State Championship. He will attend Seton Hall University this September and will be a part of the #1 nationally ranked Gerald P. Buccino '63 Center for Leadership Development at the Stillman School of Business Honors Program while studying Finance and Pre-Med in a 5 year MBA Program.

Michael told his story how life was after returning home from 2 tours in Iraq. He had great difficulty dealing with the demands of nightmares, depression, and suicidal thoughts. He shared with us how meaningful his life became the day Shutter became his service dog. Basil the Comedian was moved at our presentation that he wanted to share with us his feelings of our wonderful program. He would be honored to speak to his audience of this wonderful program and ask them to make a donation.

Michael was so overcome by our service dog program and the kindness of the Ahepans that he became a member of AHEPA before 250 delegates, he even allowed us to call his dog Shuttertopouls.



On Sept 9th we attended The Lt. Dennis W. Zilinski Memorial Gala. We have partnered with them to help them keep their son's name alive. Their son Dennis was a West Point Graduate and was killed in Iraq. That evening we donated \$45,000 that they will give it on our behalf to K9s For Warriors. They are the group that trains service dogs for veterans suffering PTSD. Part of the presentation with me was Vice Chairman Bob Fourniadas, Treasurer Demetri Orfanitopoulos, Past District Governor of the Daughters Dr. Isa Velez and veteran Michael Dowens with his dog Emery.

When we returned to our table an Army Master Sergeant said to us "that it was an honor for him to be sitting at the same table with us".

On September 16th Bob and I went to the AHEPA Leadership Conference in Washington DC. Our day started at 4:00 A.M. and we didn't returned home until 8:30 P.M. This was an important conference that the full AHEPA leadership came from all over the United States,

#### Service Dogs For Warriors

he American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association (AHEPA) kicked off their 2017 New England Regional Convention on Saturday, May 6 at the Holiday Inn in Norwich. Top on the organization's agenda was the campaign to support service members suffering from PTSD.

AHEPA is a wonderful organization that does a lot of philanthropic work all around the nation. Last year the group launched a national new project called the Service Dogs for Warriors program to help military veterans living with combat related Post Traumatic Stress Disorder. The program pairs veterans with PTSD to dogs that are trained to help them through their daily struggle and the invisible wounds of war.



George Karatzia, National Project Chairman for Service Dogs for Warriors, honored Veteran Shirley Holbrook and her service dog, Stan, in Norwich.

According to available data, suicide rate among veterans in the **United States** is estimated at

22 per day. How's this possible? AHEPANS are stepping up to say enough is enough. They are taking

action. "We as free Americans, have an obligation to do all we can to stop this epidemic." National Project Chairman, George Karatzia said. "AHEPA has said we're not going to be on the sideline. We're going to do all we can to bring the 22 down to zero."

In just one year, The AHEPA Service Dogs for Warrior Program is already hitting its stride and doing what the founders hoped it would. "We started this journey in a chapter, went to district, and now we're a national project," The National Project Chairman said in his address to the delegates. "We're saving lives, our veterans' lives." To date, the Service Dogs for Warriors program has provided six dogs to veterans that have PTSD.

Going forward, AHEPA is looking to help more service men that are struggling with PTSD. "One percent goes to war, ninety nine percent don't. Its easy math

for the ninety nine to take care of the one percent," Karatzia explained. He challenged everyone to get behind the project. "Let's work together to acquire one or more service dogs in 2017 and inspire others to do the same so we can help save the lives of those who have fought so bravely for ns"

Also speaking, Robert Fourniadis commended the efforts of the National Project Chairman in leading this cause. "This program wouldn't exist today were it not for George. He brought it to us" he said.

Veteran Shirley Holbrook and her service dog, Stan were honored at the presentation ceremony. Greg Simones, Governor AHEPA Yankee District 7 also presented a check to the Service Dogs for Warriors Program on behalf of the district

#### Wilmington Odyssey Charter School Celebrates 10th Anniversary

On Saturday September 24, 2016 the Odyssey Charter School founded and established by Wilmington Chapter No. 95 celebrated its 10th Anniversary by bringing the Olympic Torch and the Spirit and the Ideals of the Games, straight from Ancient Olympia, Greece to Delaware for the celebration of the 10th Anniversary of the Founding of the school and the Dedication of its new Barley Mill Campus.

Olympians from the United States and Greece, along with US, Greek and Delaware Dignitaries were on-hand including Delaware US Senator Chris Coons, Congressman John Carney, AHEPA District 5 Governor George N. Petrakakis, and AHEPA Supreme Governor of Region 3 Chris Diamantoukos. Delaware Governor Jack Markell also sent a video salutation in which he honored the excellence and growth of the Odyssey Charter School.

With the ending of the 2015-2016 school year, the Wilmington Chapter held a double celebration; our 95th Anniversary and the successful completion of the first 10 successful years of Odyssey Charter School.

The celebration included the Athletes from Greece that presented the Olympic Torch on Campus, Parade of the Olympic Flag by Students, Lighting of the Olympic Flame, Twinning of Odyssey with Schools from Ancient Olympia, Official Dedication of the new Barley Mills Campus, Greek Lunch and Refreshments, and over 400 participants in the 10th Annual 5K Run/Walk.

standards-based curriculum and instruction in the Greek language is delivered in a challenging, yet nurturing learning environment. Odyssey offers its students strong academics, insight into the classical learning ideals of Hellenism, a small-school environment,

The creation of Odyssey school was an opportunity to begin a miracle, which would culminate the dreams and hopes of our pioneer parents who came to this country to find the American Dream. The Hellenic heritage, which had been carried in their hearts, the philosophical ideas of Socrates, Plato and Aristotle, the engineering marvels and discoveries of Archimedes, the rhetoric of Demosthenes, the art of Pheideas, the laws of Spartan Lycurgus and Athenian Solon, the medicine of Hippocrates, the mathematics of Pythagoras and Eratosthenes, were now about to be offered to the Wilmington community, because our forefathers knew well that the Hellenic values were not the property of Greeks alone.


On August 20, 2016, the school celebrated its 10th year since its inception. The student body has now grown to 1450 students in grades K to 9 with 110 teachers and staff, including 20 Greek teachers. Our students enjoy respect for their knowledge, and pride for their accomplishments in the academic world, speak the Greek language fluently and love our culture. By Delaware public standards, Odyssey is compared with and placed well above many local public and private schools with high tuition costs.

The Odyssey Charter School is now a household word. You cannot stop in a market, restaurant, or

any friendly gathering, without someone not mentioning Odyssey and wishing to enroll their





Odyssey has been honored 9 times by the Delaware State Department of Education, and has been named as a Superior School, a title earned by very few schools in the state. Odyssey students have been performing consistently at levels of 100%, 98% and 97%, in Reading, Math., Science, and Social Studies respectively.

Our own Greek teachers, under the direction of Dr. G. Fulkerson, Director of World languages, of DEDOE, have labored to write a Foreign Language curriculum for Elementary Schools (FLES). This parallels the 21st Century standards set by the US DOE and guides the teaching of the language and writing of lesson plans, which are created by our teachers and used to properly teach the Greek language in the U.S.



During the past several years, Odyssey has been making great strides in creating partnerships with several of the most prestigious institutions of higher education.

Harvard University, Pennsylvania University, University of Delaware, Stanford University, Dartmouth College, and others have shown a strong interest in our work.

The Center of Hellenic Studies of Harvard University, through its branch at Nafplion, Greece, is collaborating with Odyssey for the past three years to create projects in which our students and students from various public schools in Peloponnesos, Greece take part.

Odyssey has been approved by the DOE, and is committed to open a High School in 2017. By the year 2020, we will see the first graduating class of students that began their education in the OCS Kindergarten, graduating from High School and entering institutions of higher learning. The total number of students of all three schools is projected to number by that time 1950 students.

After two years of planning and negotiating, OCS purchased a 34 acre campus which now houses all three schools. Brothers, this is not a temporary project that will end in a few months or in a few years. It will remain as a bright mark in the history of the Wilmington #95 AHEPA chapter, for as long as there are Ahepans who are willing to believe and live according to the precepts of AHEPA: Hellenism, Philanthropy, Education, Civic Responsibility and Individual and Family Excellence.

#### FESTIVITIES IN GREECE (Completed - June 2016)

Starting in June 2016 in Ancient Olympia, Greece, members and athletes from the Greek Olympic Committee, the Hellenic Athletics Federation, along with the Mayor of the City of Ancient Olympia, Public School Principals, and Students participated in the following events at the Ancient Olympic site:

The Mayor of the City of Ancient Olympia gifted an authentic Olympic Torch to be delivered to Odyssey Charter School for the reenactment of the lighting of the Olympic Flame, which symbolizes peace, unity, friendship, respect, excellence, fair play and joy in competition.

In the ancient tradition, students from Olympia, Greece created wreaths using branches from the olive groves of Ancient Olympia.

The Mayor of Ancient Olympia and dignitaries presented the Olympic Torch and olive wreaths to Greek athletes, who will deliver them to Odyssey Charter School at the September 24, 2016 celebration.




### Thomas Edison Chapter Update








## Ocean County Chapter Update



On Sunday, August 13th, six young men were initiated into the Sons of Pericles as new members of the Phoenix Chapter #316 of Toms River, NJ.


